- Strong interest in sport and peacebuilding;
- Cross-cultural experience and sensitivity, experience living and working in developing countries and in an unstable environment;
- Ability to work with people at all levels, ranging from high-level officials to community leaders, especially youth from multicultural environments;
- Ability to work multi-task and manage time well, ability to work to strict deadlines, and coordinate and compile information from various sources;
